MRC Research Grant

We are delighted that a recent application to the Medical Research Council Innovation Acceleration account (MRC IAA) has been funded.

Professor Charmaine Childs from Sheffield Hallam University, Health Research Institute, and project team are delighted with the good news. The team will be continuing their existing collaboration in skin and wound complications to work towards innovation in skin perfusion mapping in patients with critical limb-threatening ischaemia using hand-held real-time infrared thermography. The project is yet another step in the research programme between Sheffield Hallam and University of Huddersfield (Prof Karen Ousey) but widens the academic and research partnership to the NHS via links with Sheffield Teaching Hospitals NHS Trust, Mid-Yorks NHS Trust, University of Sheffield and commercial partner PyrOptik Instruments UK.

The study will be 'ready to go' on 22nd January and will run for 12 months. We are looking forward to welcoming our new researcher, Kevin Doyle, senior podiatrist, Dr Natasha Levy and Dr Mark Collins to the team as well as our new academic and NHS Trust partners.
